Activ8 more imagination by assigning each of the letters in the alphabet a number starting with the number 1 and ending with the number 26 representing the “easy to see” number assignment of the letters. This set of assigned numbers located on the left side of the table below is labeled “Seen Number”.

The right side of the table lists the numbers in reverse order and is labeled “Unseen Numbers”. The obvious or “seen number” for A is 1 while the “unseen number” and less obvious number for A is 26.

Use the table as the tool to explore how any word can be made into an equation while producing a “seen number” and an “unseen number”.

If imagination created every letter from the beginning, wouldn't it be responsible for naming you? Of course, in the physical life, our parents named us. If you ask them why, they may or may not have an exact reason. Even if they have an exact reason, keep asking why. Eventually, after asking why enough times, the answer will be universal.
